**ACTIVITY 1**

**Listen to items 1a-4a and choose the best option (A-F) as in the example. There is one option that you do not need.**

### **ACTIVITY 1**

## **ACTIVITY 2**

**Listen and fill in items 6b-10b with the right word, as in the example.**

Example: So, Put the butter and sugar together in a bowl and beat the eggs in one at a time. Once you've beaten the eggs in and got this lovely creamy mixture, you're going to sift in the flour, the cocoa powder and the baking powder and fold the mixture together.
